LATE HEADING

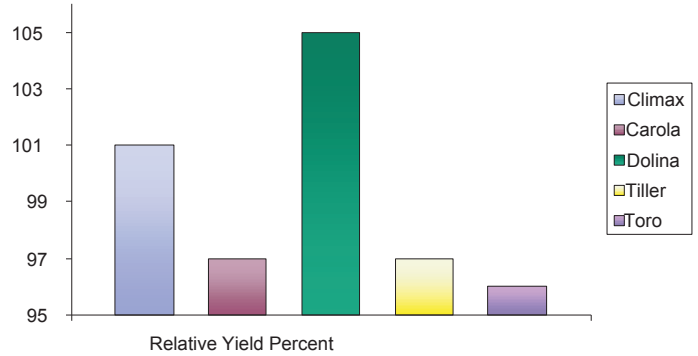
Timothy is widely used for horse hay both as a straight variety and in mixtures with other grasses and legumes. In addition, Timothy is well suited for locations that are saturated with water for a part of the year. Recently there has been much interest in late maturing varieties, like **DOLINA**. Some advantages of a late maturing variety are that the Timothy is ready for harvest after alfalfa and other grasses, allowing the producer to harvest other forages first and spread his labor efforts. They are also more grazing tolerant and have a better potential for regrowth if they are harvested before heading out fully. **DOLINA** has performed well in trials in the Northern US and Canada. The re-growth after the first cutting is superior to earlier maturing varieties.



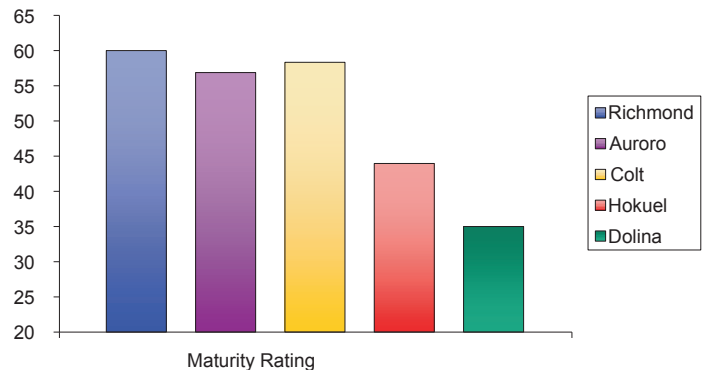
SEEDING RATE
